Our mixed year three and four futsal team came home victorious from their finals, having played brilliantly as a team, showing fantastic skills, teamwork and sportsmanship.

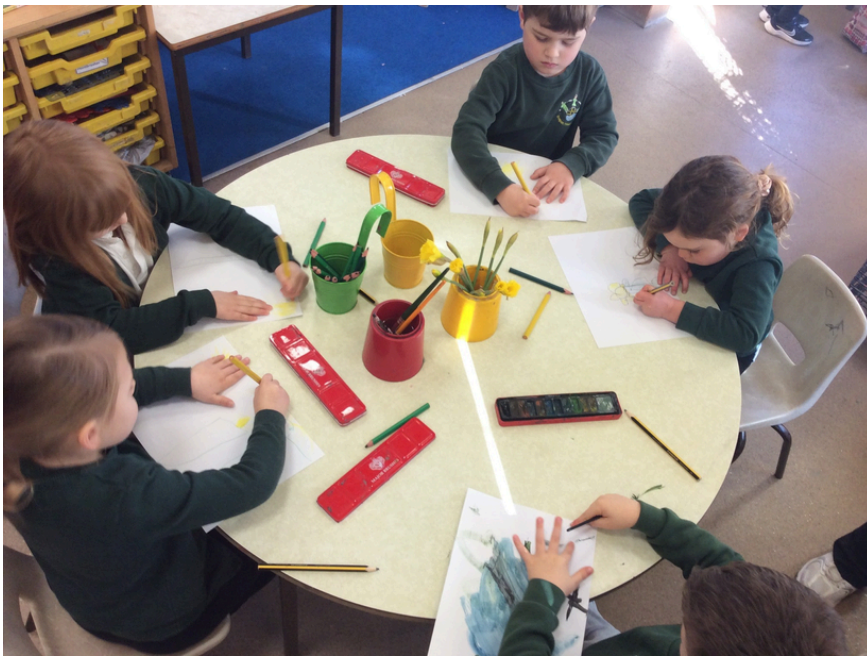

Year three took part in a dance festival, having worked hard with Mr James to learn their routines.

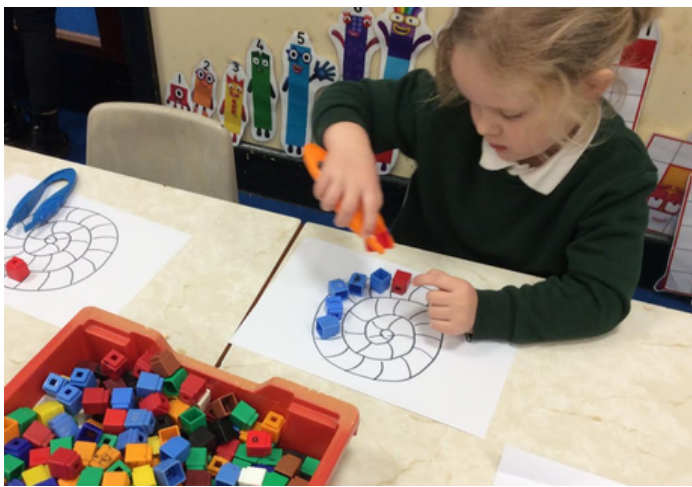

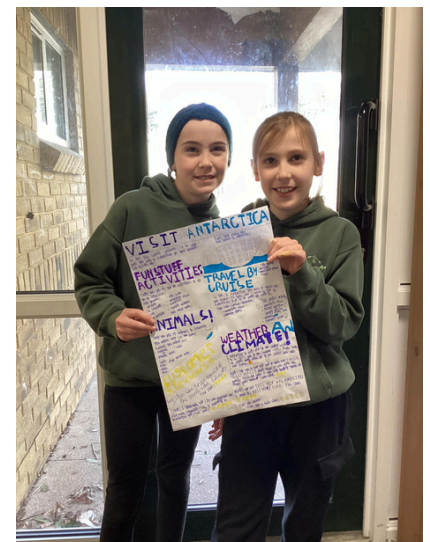
